



# Timely Warning Crime Bulletin

## -Sexual Battery-

This Timely Warning Bulletin is being issued in compliance with the Jeanne Clery Act. The purpose is to provide preventative information to the campus community to aid members from becoming the victim of a crime.

**Incident:** Sexual Battery

**Location:** 5500 Block of Hardy Avenue

**Date/Time:** Jan. 24, 2022, 1 a.m.

**Warning issued:** Jan. 27, 2022, 12:25 p.m.

**Summary:**

On Jan. 24 at 1 a.m., a female who is not an SDSU student, faculty or staff member was in the area of the 5500 block of Hardy Avenue when an adult white male approached her. The individual then assaulted the woman, who was able to free herself and leave the area. She was uninjured during the incident. Investigators are actively following up on several leads relating to the report.

**Suspect:**

The suspect is described as an adult white male, between 20 and 22 years old, 6 feet tall, with blond hair and blue eyes. The suspect was wearing a black T-shirt and baseball hat and had an athletic build. The suspect was last seen leaving the area on foot toward Lindo Paseo.

**The San Diego State University Police Department (UPD) is investigating this incident, as Case #22-81.**
